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The Ocean and Climate Platform

What is the Ocean and Climate Platform?

- An international coalition of ocean stakeholders which brought together non-governmental organizations, scientific institutions (research, universities, aquariums, associations...), maritime actors, expeditions, French organizations and international agencies.
- Launched on 10 June 2014 during the World Oceans Day, with the support of IOC-UNESCO.

Why?

- To promote scientific research on ocean, climate and biodiversity interactions
- To support the advocacy of ocean, climate and biodiversity issues
- To disseminate scientific knowledge to policy makers, civil society and the media

















An international platform embodying 70 organizations

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« From science to policy » -4 key areas of action

SCIENCE

- Promoting scientific understanding of ocean, climate and biodiversity interactions.
- Disseminating knowledge through the publication of scientific notes.

ADVOCACY

- Identifying priorities to include the ocean in the Global Climate Action Agenda.
- Participating to the major international conferences on climate change.

AWARENESS

- Increasing awareness on the importance of ocean and biodiversity in the climate system.
- Mobilizing the general public, civil society and youth within UN frameworks on climate and biodiversity (COPs for example).

YOUTH

- Supporting young scientists from varied disciplines
- Encouraging their participation in the construction and promotion of scientific knowledge

- Contributing to getting the ocean integrated within the framework of the Paris Agreement.
- States' mobilization within the scope of the « Because the Ocean » declaration, signed by 35 countries.
- The integration of the ocean within the Global Climate Action Agenda, and the launch of a dedicated oceans action day during COP22 and COP23.
- The launch of the Ocean and Climate Initiatives Alliance in February 2017 and the publication of its first action-oriented report on measuring progress on ocean and climate initiatives.

















The central project of the Ocean and Climate Platform: the Ocean and Climate Initiatives Alliance (OCIA)

- Launched on 22 February 2017 by the Ocean and Climate Platform, with the support of IOC-UNESCO and France.
- OCIA intends to drive momentum for concrete ocean-based solutions in the implementation of mitigation and adaptation measures.

Core objectives:

- 1. Identifying synergies between international initiatives and acting as a catalyst for progress.
- 2. Stimulating scientific awareness and reducing knowledge gaps on our understanding of ocean, climate and biodiversity interactions.
- 3. Ensuring that civil society's voice is heard in the international fora (UNFCCC, Global Climate Agenda, SDG14...).
